



On September 26-28, Luka Iakobidze, a 2nd-year student of the Faculty of Health Economics and Management of University Geomedi, participated in the international conference "Peace and Sustainable Mountain Tourism - Challenges and Opportunities". The event was held at the Technical University of Georgia and was dedicated to World Tourism Day. The purpose of this conference was to facilitate the collaboration of Georgian and foreign students, generating innovative ideas and sharing knowledge and experience among students.

Luka Iakobidze presented the report on the topic: "Effectiveness of management of the use of medical and recreational tourism resources."

Georgian and foreign students of undergraduate, master's, and doctoral educational programs participated in the conference. Georgian and foreign scientists from Italy, Canada, and Germany also delivered speeches at the plenary session. They discussed with students the Global and local challenges of sustainable development of tourism.

The results of the conference were summarized at the final event. Prizes were awarded to authors of the best scientific, thematic, or online reports.



The organization "Medlink Society" was created on the initiative of Ritika Bhatia, a student of the Faculty of Medicine at the University Geomedi, which aims to develop research, presentation, and communication skills among students of the Faculty of Medicine. We held the next training - webinar on writing abstracts on June 5, in which invited professors of University Geomedi - Anjum Pervez and professor Pervez Abdul Razak participated. They talked about practices and techniques that make the abstract structured and effective. The webinar was well received. Participants were awarded certificates.

The next event, which was held on July 2, was about diabetes symptoms, management, and recent and practical advances. The three best abstracts were selected and their authors: Purav Ahlawat, Sharvari Prasad Kadam, and Joan Susan Zacharias were allowed to present their topics. The meeting was interactive. Both speakers and participants were awarded certificates.

At the last meeting on August 7, we discussed perfecting the abstracts. It was a feedback session in which attendees received personalized advice on how to improve their papers, making them more effective in journal and conference submissions.

These events have contributed to a deeper understanding of research practice and the development of research skills. SAS invites students to join the team to share and gain knowledge.

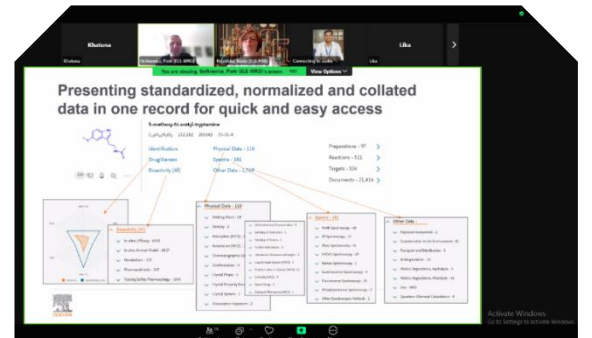
Webinar: Modern teaching methods and the use of e-resources in academic education

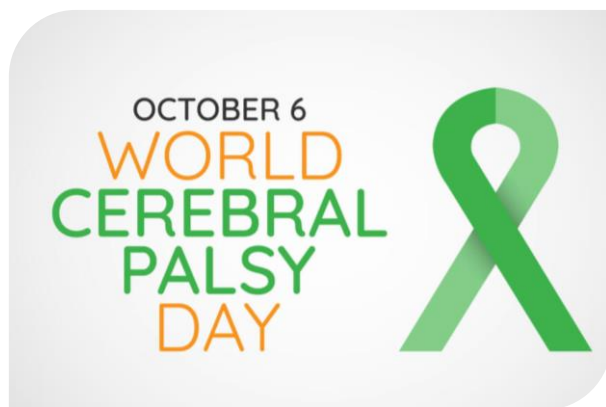
