Georgian Universiade - 2021 starts!

"Georgian Universiade 2021", which is organized by the Sports Federation of Georgian Universities and sponsored by the Ministry of Culture, Sports and Youth of Georgia will be held from May 25 to June 30, 2021.

University Geomedi won its first Medal in 2013. Since then it has been improving the results every year. The last two Universiades have been especially successful. In 2018, Geomedi students won 3 gold, 2 silver, and 3 bronze medals, and took 7th place in the overall team standings (among more than 40 universities), and the 5th-7th place in the number of



gold medals with GTU and Iliani.

"Georgian Universiade 2021" is the qualifying stage of "European Universiade 2022". Imeda Gogoladze, a student of the University Faculty of Medicine, is a silver medalist of the World Sambo Championship. He will become the participant in Judo Europe / World Universiade in case of victory.

Our students will participate in the following sports at Georgian Universiade-2021: badminton, judo, sambo, Georgian wrestling, table tennis, 3X3 basketball, and water rafting.

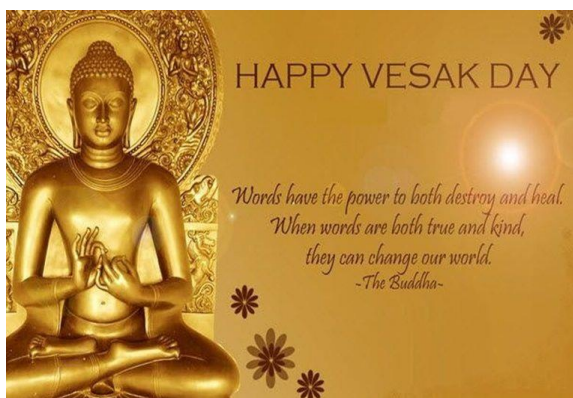

Independence Day of Georgia

Georgia celebrates Independence Day on May 26 and this is Georgia's national day. Following the Russian revolution and the defeats in the First World War, movements within Georgia pushed for independence from Russia and on May 26th 1918, Georgia declared itself as an independent democratic republic. Independence Day is associated with military parades, fireworks, concerts, political speeches, ceremonies and so on.



Vesak



Vesak (Buddha Purnima, Buddha Jayanti) is a Buddhist festival that marks Gautama Buddha's birth, enlightenment and death. It falls on the day of the full Moon in April or May and it is a public holiday in India. In 2021 this day was celebrated on May 26.

Many Buddhists visit temples on Vesak to listen to monks give talks and recite ancient verses. Devout Buddhists may spend all day in one or more temples. Some display a small statue of Buddha as a baby. The statue is placed in a basin filled with water and decorated with flowers. Visitors to the temple pour water over the statue. This symbolizes a pure and new beginning. Many people also give money, food or goods to organization that help the poor, the elderly and those who are sick.

Gautama Buddha was a spiritual teacher in India during and after his lifetime. Festivals to honor Buddha were held for many centuries. The decision to celebrate Vesak as the Buddha's birthday was formalized at the first conference of the World Fellowship of Buddhists in May, 1950.

On Vesak Day, Buddhists all over the world commemorate events of significance to Buddhists of all traditions: The birth, enlightenment and the passing away of Gautama Buddha. As Buddhism spread from India it was assimilated into many foreign cultures, and consequently Vesak is celebrated in many different ways all over the world.



The University Geomedi and the entire scientific community has a great loss. **Nugzar Aleksidze** – Georgian academician passed away. He was an academician of the Georgian Academy of Sciences, Medical Biology, Ecology, Natural Sciences and Egrisi Academies. Member of the International Organization for the Study of the Brain (IBRO) and the European Neurochemists International (ENS) and many other international organizations.

For the Successes achieved in the development of the national economy and the science of biology and for the fruitful pedagogical activity, N. Aleksidze had received various orders and medals.

Nugzar Aleksidze is included in the list of astrobiologists, which was sent to Mars on February 18, 2021. He has published more than 400 scientific papers, including 18 textbooks, 4 methodological references and 11 monographs.

He was the author of 18 inventions, had obtained a patent for an ecological model of the planet Mars. Nugzar Aleksidze was included in the list of 500 eminent scientists of the world.
