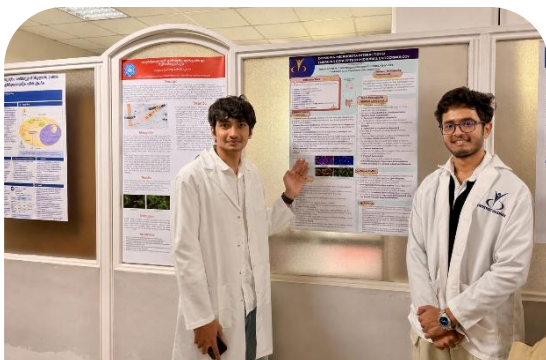

One of the largest student festivals of the year - Studfest 2026, took place from May 1 to June 14, in which students of the University Geomedi won prizes and represented themselves and the university with dignity.

Students have demonstrated outstanding achievements in both sports and academics. Lisa Kalinina participated in the rock-climbing competition and took 3rd place. The University Geomedi team also became the winner of the bowling tournament. Mariam Kulumbegashvili took 3rd place in the table tennis tournament.



As part of Studfest 2026, the intellectual game Bookshelf was also held in the Public Broadcasting Company. As a result of the points total, the University Geomedi team took 3rd place. The team members were:

Erekle Jokhadze's result deserves special mention - in the blitz stage, he recorded a perfect result, 15/15, which became one of the most outstanding moments of the game.

The competition was highly competitive, with tense and interesting stages, where participants had to demonstrate their knowledge, quick thinking, and teamwork to the maximum.

University Geomedi students also achieved success in the mini-football tournament, where they faced the team of the Shota Rustaveli State University of Theatre and Cinema of Georgia and won the match with a score of 5:1.

On June 18, the closing event of "Studentfest 2026" was held at the Paragraph Hotel, where the winning students were awarded.



The student club - MedLink Society organized an online meeting on the topic: "Medical-Legal Reality for Doctors", the purpose of which was to familiarize medical students with the legal and ethical aspects of healthcare practice. The invited speaker at the session was Advocate Mahesh Arasu, who works in the Supreme Court of India and has extensive practical experience in medical-legal issues related to the healthcare sector. The topics discussed at the meeting were: informed consent, medical documentation, legal liability of doctors, professional conduct, social media ethics, etc.

Through an interesting and thought-provoking discussion, the participants were introduced to the main medical-legal concepts that play an increasingly important role in modern medical practice.

The participants also had the opportunity to understand the real challenges that doctors may encounter during their careers.



The Student Academic Society- SAS, in partnership with Incredoc, conducted Praxis, a series of hands-on workshops designed to provide students with interactive learning and practical application of knowledge. The opening workshop focused on the importance of anatomy in medicine and the different types of surgical wounds. Students explored how knowledge of anatomy forms the basis of diagnosis and surgical procedures. At the same time, they were introduced to the principles of wound technique.

The second workshop focused on cardiac anatomy through the dissection of a bovine heart. Held over two weeks and divided into four separate sessions, the sessions allowed participants to identify the main structures of the heart, including valves and major blood vessels.

Activities such as dissection, suturing practice, and clinical discussions made the sessions particularly engaging for the students. A defining feature of every Praxis workshop was the immersive clinical case-solving component. During these half-hour sessions, participants collaborated on patient scenarios, applying theoretical knowledge to clinical reasoning, diagnosis, and management in simulated settings. The exercises encouraged analytical thinking, teamwork, and problem-solving skills while reinforcing practical understanding.

From May 15 to May 18, the four-day ENT FMGE Masterclass, organized by the Student Academic Society SAS in collaboration with Arise Medical Academy, brought together medical students from various universities and offered them an intensive, high-level event to prepare for the upcoming licensing exams - FMGE.

The masterclass was led by Dr. Rajiv Dhawan, an internationally recognized ENT specialist, clinician, and high-yield learning experiences. His lectures bridged the gap between theory and practice through very interactive, structured and clinically focused teaching. Highly interactive lectures were interesting and fruitful for the students because they focused on optimizing memory for the material and increasing confidence for the exam.
