The library is an integral part of the University. Its main function is to organize printed and electronic funds and maximally meet the needs of consumers using modern technologies. It contains educational, scientific and auxiliary literature, periodicals required for the specialties of the university. International electronic databases such as EBSCO and Elsevier are also available. Electronic databases and electronic catalogs of books can be accessed both in the library and outside the library. In total, the fund includes 17 4012 print and 3083 electronic resources.

The library serves students, professors, and administration representatives. The library, according to the requirements offers a variety of resources and services to its users including learning and auxiliary spaces: reading hall, book archive, consultation, computer and copy rooms. The library funds are constantly updated. There is a register of non-existent resource requests by users for the library's intellectual resources, according to which the library's print and digital funds are replenished.

During a pandemic (COVID 19) the library works following the recommendations. To ensure a smooth learning process, the University and the Library have provided access to electronic versions of the book fund, providing unrestricted open access for students and lecturers remotely. The library is properly prepared for the new academic year. Both Georgian and English language books and electronic resources are in place and updated.

Gaurav Bhati, a graduate of our University's Faculty of Medicine, donated five English-language and three Georgian books to the library. He was a frequent visitor to the library and expressed his gratitude with this beautiful gesture. Thanks to Gaurav Bhati for this worthy behavior.
