

The International, peer-reviewed Journal “Early Childhood Special Education” has published an article “Online Learning of Students with Special Needs: Teachers’ Perspectives”. The paper was conducted in collaboration with researchers and students from several universities:

The research aims to study the online learning challenges for students with special needs during the COVID-19 pandemic. The survey showed that the majority of respondents are in favor of lessons conducted in classes because it helps them to develop social skills. In addition, learning in the classroom facilitates the development of motor and face-to-face communication skills due to the variety of resources available. In

this regard, collaborative learning and physical contact are important for students with special educational needs. Some students do not have access to the Internet and have not been able to use online learning platforms. Given the increasing use of online learning technologies in education, access to them is important for students with disabilities. When using these technologies, the context of teaching materials and favorable environment for students with disabilities should be taken into consideration.

The International Journal of Early Childhood Special Education is indexed in the SCOPUS (Elsevier) International Science Database.

At this stage, students gain practical knowledge with the head of the radiology department of the German hospital, doctor-radiologist Davit Gogiashvili. Hospital staff is also involved in the University’s academic and scientific activities.



On March 4, 2022, the presentation of the monograph “The role of endogenous peptides in the systemic self-regulation of organisms” was held in the Library Hall of Teaching University Geomedi. The author of the book is associate professor Malkhaz Vakhania, who is the Head of the Laboratory of Molecular Medicine of Scientific Research Institute of Experimental and Clinical Medicine at University Geomedi.

It is noteworthy, that the above-mentioned monograph became the winner of the grant competition announced by the Rustaveli Georgian National Science Foundation. The monograph describes the role of endogenous peptides in the processes of animal life and the self-regulation of living organisms. The book is available at the University Library.



January 12, 2022, the memorandum of cooperation has been signed between Teaching University Geomedi, presented by its Rector Professor Marina Pirtskhalava, and Krtsanisi District Administration of Tbilisi Municipality, presented by the head of Krtsanisi district Mr. Beka Mikautadze.

The signatories agreed to implement joint social and healthcare projects and cooperate in various fields. The Head of Krtsanisi District viewed University’s material-technical base along with the university’s administration and staff. The meeting was held in a warm and friendly atmosphere.



In February 2022, the Faculty of Dentistry conducted an Objectively Structured Clinical Examination – OSCE. This format for final exams has been successfully implemented at the faculty of Dentistry since 2020.

The examination was conducted in the University’s dental phantom laboratory and university dental clinic. Students’ theoretical knowledge and clinical skills were assessed by examiners who are certified by the University of Leeds.

OSCE aims to assess the student's clinical skills and enhance practical experience. OSCE is the best way to test a student's theoretical knowledge, clinical and communication skills in a simulated environment. 11 "stations" were organized with the support of the University administration and the efforts of the dean of the faculty. Students' entry into the examination area and movement between stations was supervised by support staff. We used an objective and transparent assessment system to evaluate students. The points obtained were summarized by the members of the examination commission with full transparency. We entered student assessments into the electronic learning process management system.

Importantly, objectively structured clinical examination(OSCE) was well planned and organized. Accordingly, the examination process was positively evaluated by the university administration and examining colleagues.




