Internationalization Policy

Based on the mission of LLC Teaching University Geomedi, one of the most important priorities of the university is integration into the global educational area.

The University has developed an internationalization policy in order to accomplish this mission. The goal of the policy is to develop partnerships and collaborative projects with different international institutions, ensure the involvement of students and university personnel in international-level teaching-learning and research projects.

The University's Internationalization Policy and Directions (planned activities) are approved by the Academic Board, along with the University's Strategic Development Plan on the basis of the "University Personnel and Student Internationalization Policy Development Questionnaire" analysis.

Internationalization Policy 2018-2025

Based on the results of the survey (students and personnel), the following directions were developed to plan the university's internationalization policy:

- 1) Student exchange programs
- 2) Exchange programs for academic staff
- 3) Integration of exchange programs into curriculum

- 4) Exchange programs for administrative staff
- 5) Involvement of foreign teachers/professors in the teaching process
- 6) Enhanced teaching of English language
- 7) Joint educational programs with foreign HEIs
- 8) Joint Scientific Researches and Conferences with foreign Higher Education Institutions
- 9) Using the foreign labor market surveys in program modification process
- 10) Attracting foreign students to educational programs
